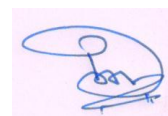

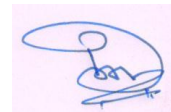

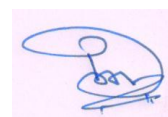
Best Practice – II

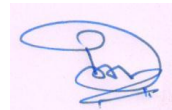

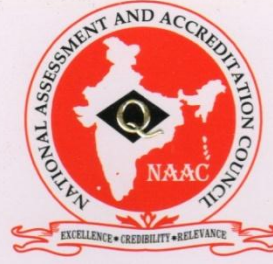

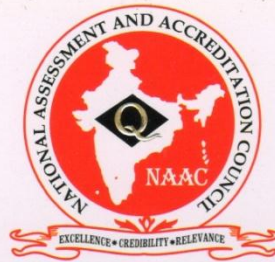
