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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Deshbhakt Babasaheb Bhausaheb Khanjire Shikshan Sanstha's, Night College of Arts & Commerce, Ichalkaranji (Dist. Kolhapur, Maharashtra) is one of the leading higher education institute in Kolhapur district. The college has come into existence to fulfill the growing need of quality higher education of neighborhood society, specially deprived and working community & who were unable to seek admission in a regular college in Ichalkaranji city and its peripheral area. The institution was established in 1983 with the name of late freedom fighter Deshbhakt Babasaheb Bhausaheb Khanjire, who was politician and social worker but he dedicated his entire life for the welfare of the worker and small entrepreneur community in Ichalkaranji. The college was also established in 1983. It has affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The college is recognized UGC under section 12th B of the UGC Act 1956 – R-20/98 dated 10/08/1998 and 2F- F-8/131/93 dated 14/08/1993". Since last 39 years, the college has been pursuing to empower the weaker, working and deprived students and has achieved great success by adopting the motto, "Work is Worship". The college has its own two storied building with specious play ground and needed infrastructural facilities. The college celebrated its **Silver Jubilee in 2008-09**. The college has 720 students admission in current academic year 2022-23. Despite of night college 164 girls and women students admitted in the college. The college started at evening time. It has convenient to all students to attend regular college. The college offers two programmes and eleven courses along with some Carrier Oriented Courses from 2010. Always our college has been socially & ethically committed institution for providing quality higher education in terms of academic and various curricular and co-curricular activities, i.e. sports, cultural and NSS, Rotaract club and Vivek Vahini etc. In last five year our college students perform very well in sports activities and bags lot of awards and medals. During the panic covid-19 pandemic situation all the teachers were engaged in online teaching & learning. Still now college has got success to create employability among the students and also make good character and socially responsible citizens in the society.

Our college was first accredited and assessed by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore in 10/01/2004 and awarded 'B' grade with institutional score of 70.70 on. The second cycle accreditation by NAAC was completed as on 04/09/2010 and NAAC awarded 'B+' grade with 2.70 score. On 25/02/2016 the college went for its third cycle and achieve ' B ' grade with 2.80 CGPA.

Our Student Miss. Kothavale Prafullrani Arun B.A.III (2019-20) and Miss. Kalgude Sugandha Balu- B.A.I April 2020 and other 07 students achieved rank position in Shivaji University Examination and got prestigious Merit scholarship.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) & CDC has taking full efforts for to create excellence in teaching, learning and evaluation as well as co-curricular activities taking into account vision and mission and the recommendation of NAAC Peer Team. During last five years college promoted one Associate Professor to Professor and '3' Assistant Professor promoted to Associate Professor as per guidelines of the 7th CPC. All the teachers are dedicated and well qualified with Ph.D. degree holders and always engaged in research work.

- 3) Vacant posts of teaching and non-teaching staff due to government policy. More dependency on the temporary(CHB) faculty.
- 4) Due to Non availaity of UGC Grants for new research project and development faculties have no scope for work on major or minor research projects.
- 5) No patents, no international linkages and collaborations.

Institutional Opportunity

- 1) To strengthen the network with neighborhood industry & community for learning considering to do more practical curricular and extra co-curricular activities.
- 2) To organize more National/ International conferences and seminars.
- 3) To strengthen the various academic departments for providing research and consultancy services.
- 4) More scope for skill based COC's.
- 5) To start PG programmes in Arts & Commerce programmes.
- 6) To promote research activities to increase MOU and collaborations.
- 7) Scope for to provide consultancy service by some selected departments and to strengthen institution-industry relations.

- 9) Wide scope for more guidance and counseling about various competitive examinations.

- * During the last five year, 01 faculty members successfully worked as a BOS member in Shivaji University, Kolhapur.
- * Teaching plan, syllabus completion reports, result analysis are prepare by all the faculties for effective teaching-learning and evaluation. Along with this academic calendar, departmental planning and implementation strategy of co-curricular and extra co-curricular activities has been worked out.
- * On the backdrop of Covid-19 pandemic situation, all the faculties were fulfill their teaching task through online teaching & learning mode.
- * More than 38.43% students to undertake field projects and to participate in workshop, seminars & conferences held in the college.
- * Our college has not only implement effectively planned curriculum but also along with it emphasize the entire cross cutting issues related to ethics & social values.
- * Our college has always implented robust and transperent feedback system.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Teaching-learning and evaluation process have great importance to enhance quality higher education. So our college always focuses on to make effective plans and also monitoring system to evaluate teaching-learning and evaluation process.

- 7) All the POs and Cos have been timely displayed on the college website as well as department notice boards.
- 8) The college examination committee has make flexible, but transparent examination schedule for internal evaluation at the beginning of the academic year.
- 9) Internal and also university exams for B.A./B.Com – I has held at college level and grievances related to this are resolved through separate redressal mechanism for both internal and university level exams.
- 10) Group discussion, seminars, project work, class tests, oral tests were conducted to assess students performance, guest lectures, lead college workshops and study tours are also arranged to update students knowledge.
- 11) The average pass percentage of final year students is 92.64%.
- 12) Despite of teaching-learning numerous co-curricular and extra co-curricular activities are also organized by all the faculties for multidimensional developed of the students.
- 13) The result analysis is done at the end of every semester at department and subject teacher level.
- 14) Always IQAC in our college motivate and give support to every teacher and department of quest of excellence.

Research, Innovations and Extension

To a large extent, the quality and status of any higher education institution is determined by the research work done by the faculties. Our faculties have also always engaged in research work and have number of publications.

- 1) 100% faculty members are Ph.D. holders and seven faculty members are recognized as research guides. 08 students are enrolled for research under them.
- 2) During the assessment period college received Rs.10,000 Rs for Studnt research projects from SUK entitled “**Clean India Mission – To aware peoples in Ichalkaranji city and peripheral area through street play activity and to study the effects**”
- 3) In the last five year, the college organized 05 conferences/ Workshops/ Seminars.
- 4) Our faculty members have 215 research publications in various sources. The research papers are published in peer, referred, indexed and having impact factors under UGC care lists. In the assessment period total 98 research papers were published.
- 5) The college has organized 250 extension activities in assessment period.
- 6) Seven MOU is collaborated between college and many NGO’s and other social institutions.

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences using ICT tools

Response:

All the faculties of our college make planning at individual level for better teaching learning Process. For this they use various students-centric methods, i.e. chalk-talk lecture method along with ICT enabled methodologies, experiential learning, participative learning, problem solving methodologies, etc. The entire department teacher use chalk-talk lecture method extensively. But very important, complicated topics in syllabus by use ICT-enabled teaching methodologies. For experiential learning, industrial visits and study tours, field visits were organized by the departments like, commerce, geography, psychology, economics etc. These type of activities are useful for enhance experiential learning. In every academic year, the commerce dept. visits the Industrial Estates in surrounding areas. The Geography department arranges study tour for participative teaching, faculties of various department use methodologies like group discussion, role plays, seminar presentation, participation in departmental activities, organization of lead college workshop etc. Almost all departments organize group discussion activities formally or informally in which students actively participate and express their views freely on concern issues. For participative learning teachers organize seminars on assigned topics in curriculum. To that students write their seminar papers with the help of discussion, reference books and other online resources. Majority language departments organize essay competitions, mural magazine presentation (It boosts skill of writing, painting and presentation etc), poetry recitation etc. To obtain better excellence in teaching and learning, our institute identify slow and advance learners of particular important subjects, i.e., English, Accountancy and Statistics. A special coaching has provided to them with planned time table. All the departments organize various activities in which students actively participate and it boosts their learning experience. Despite of that all the departments organize seminar, oral test activities as part of continuous internal evaluation process.

Now a day's use of technology in teaching learning process is going to be part and parcel. It has now a call of time and inheritable parts of the teaching-learning process. The Various ICT tools, like, LCD/LED projectors, computers, laptops, smart phones; TV etc. Were also used by the faculties in teaching-learning and evaluation process. Various mobile applications, i.e. Google classroom, zoom; Google Meet etc. are widely used by faculties in teaching learning and evaluation process. Almost all departments and faculty members were used this applications to attend webinars, FDP, Refresher courses as well as for to teach the students through online mode in lockdown period on the backdrop of covid-19 pandemic situation. Despite of that, other platforms like e-PG pathashala, National digital library of India, INFLIBNET, Shodhaganga etc., are enhances the scope of ICT-based tools used for effective teaching and learning process. The department of English have a well-equipped language laboratory. Which is helps students to improve their linguistic skills and learning skills of English. This language laboratory has also been used by other language departments like; Marathi, Urdu and Hindi to the purpose of improve knowledge of linguistic skills. Rather than the language lab, our institute have well-equipped computer laboratories. That is widely used by the students and faculties for improve technology-enabled teaching and learning particularly in lockdown period of this academic year every faculties made class wise whats-app groups for online teaching as well as mentioning to the students.

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

Evaluation of the progress in learning of the students has great importance to improve him and betterment of teaching-learning process. Considering continues internal evaluation, our institute has decided to conduct class tests twice in a year. An instruction related to tentative time schedule of class tests were including in academic calendar of each year. The instruction of the class test is communicated to the students well in advance by notices circulated in the classroom by examination dept. The mechanism of class tests is simple but transparent. Class tests were conducted by the subject teachers as per their regular time table within declared period by exam dept. Dates of the class tests are decided as per convenience of the students. No separate time table is prepared for the class tests. Written answer papers are checked by the subject teacher within time. Finally results were announced by the concerns teachers in the classroom. The answer sheets with the suggestion were returned to the students as a study material for further preparation of the university semester examinations. Majority of the students of our college are belongs to worker community and deprived class in the society. So, the time of class tests were made flexible as their work hours were not disturbed and the education remain undisturbed. So all the faculty members has given total freedom for conducting exams and evaluation throughout the semester. Despite of class tests, every subject teacher assesses the students by administering classroom activities (seminar, oral test, project works, group discussion activities etc.). Absent students have facility to resubmit their performance.

The evaluation of B.A. /B. Com – I students is done at college level. But mechanism of conducting these exams is similar to University exams, and also transparent. All teachers prepare question papers and asses an answer sheets in prescribed time as per university rules. And the written examination for assessment of B. A. / B. Com II and III has conducted by the affiliated University. Online internal marks are submitted to the university through college login accounts on the university internal examination portal. Our institution has strictly take care that to dealing with

grievances is transparent, time bound and efficient. As per the Maharashtra Public University Act, 2016, Shivaji University Board of examination and Evaluation (BDEF) have developed the mechanism to deal with grievances related to all activities and mechanism of examinations. Grievances related to all internal examinations (class test, oral test, seminar, project work etc) are solved at the college department level. Student's grievance related to internal and external examination was solved through a system and a proper process lay down by the college and the university.

As per university rule, there is a separate provision for redressal of grievances of the University examinations students must submit written application about grievances. The student can get solution about revaluation, reassessment or demand for photocopy of answer book. The similar to University examinations related mechanism to deal with internal examination grievances. The Examination department of the college has deal with grievances of internal examination. Both the internal and external examination related grievances are solved satisfactorily.

Response:

– A well-structured and planned syllabus and specifications of each course has vital importance for the effective delivery of knowledge regarding the particular subject. An evaluation of programme outcomes, course outcomes is having great importance in accordance with students' academic progress. Program outcomes (PO's) and Course outcomes (CO's) for all the program has describes for what students are expected to know about each program and course. Particularly these are mainly related to knowledge, skills, capabilities and behaviour of students acquire through program and courses. With effect from 2017-18, the CBCS pattern was introduced. Since the academic year 2019-20 onwards, the choice based credit system (CBCS) was made in accordance with the learning outcomes based on curriculum frame work (LOCF) of National Education Policy, (NEP) 2020. Our college follows the curriculum prescribed by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur, and all the learning outcomes and course outcomes are stated. For all the courses offered to the students as per approved by the University. IQAC has timely note this and well inform to all the teachers. Students can get information about programme outcomes and course outcomes from the college website. The POs and COs are communicated to the stakeholders through the institutional website. At the time of

admission, students get information about POs a COs through dialogue admission committee members. We always consider POs and COs while designing extra and co-curricular activities for student outcomes. Every new academic year newly admitted students are provided opportunities to interact with senior students and alumni to learn about their past experiences about overall teaching and learning process as well as curriculum and extra co-curriculum activities.

Our college has developed the method of evaluate POs and COs. It has not sticky. Changes made it in time as per necessity. Following are the measures implemented for evaluation attainment of POs and COs.

1. Our institution has a mechanism of evaluate the POs, PSO and Cos, through continuous internal evaluation and semester wise final examination of each course and each programme. Internal assessment and semester examinations held areas per guidelines by the affiliated University. As per University guidelines final year of UG degree, 20 % marks in each course are awarded through internal assessment, 80 % marks through end-semester written examinations. As per performance of the student (Result declared by the university) in the above examinations, every teacher asses POs and COs. Finally appropriate measures are suggested.

2. For the continues internal evaluation, class tests, individual assignments as well as group discussion, seminar, oral tests, project work, field work are arranged. Participation in study tours, industrial and field visits, student's participation in college level activities (sports, NSS, cultural as well as co-curricular and extra-curricular activities is also consider to that. All the subject teachers evaluate performance of the students in the context of the POs and COs

The General Body of Deshbhakt Babasaheb Bhausaheb Khanjire Shikshan Sanstha has effective control over the overall administration of the college. The principal of the college is accountable to the General Body and College Development Committee (C.D.C.). The college strictly follows statute, service rules, procedures, recruitment, and policies of UGC, State Govt., and affiliated Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

The college has adopted strategic and perspective plan to achieve goals and objectives as well as activities related to teaching - learning and evaluation and co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The strategic plan based on to take account of the recommendations of peer team of for quality enhancement of IIIrd cycle is as follows.

- 1) Being an affiliated college curriculum designed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur has to be accepted.
- 2) For pleasures and holistic teaching - learning and evaluation –
 - a) The conventional teaching aids are used.
 - b) Besides chalk-talk the ICT tools are used.
 - c) Student centric methods for experiential and participative learning were uses, i.e. group discussion, oral, quiz, study tour, etc.
 - d) For ICT learning wide access of internet facility through computer lab is provided.
 - e) To encourage students into activities related to their enhancement& development schemes, i.e., career counselling, soft skill development, competitive exam guidance, Yoga and meditation etc.
 - f) To take efforts for students involvement in use of library, language lab, computer lab etc.
 - g) Internal examination committee carries out exam work.

University central assessment is conducted in the college for B. A. I / B. Com. I and the rest, i.e. B. A. / B. Com. II & III are sent to the CAP centres allotted by the University. Being an affiliated college, the college follows the guidelines, statutes and, Maharashtra University public Act 2016, Shivaji University, Kolhapur and the state government of Maharashtra. The following are the main organs of the institution.

1. Deshbhakt Babasaheb Bhausaheb Khanjire Shikshan Sanstha, Ichalkaranji. - It has the highest body at the institutional level. The managing council of the institute decides various progressive policies and procedures related all type of infrastructural development, strategic, perspective plans, financial assistance, as well as supervision and follows up of implementation.
2. College Development Committee (CDC)-This is highest statutory governing body at the college level, which is formed according to rules of Maharashtra University Public Act, 2016. Maximum three or minimum two meetings would be held in one academic year. This committee gives sanctions to the yearly budget and financial statements. This committee has taken review of the academic progress and also makes suggestions to improve it.
3. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) - The IQAC is the main functional body at the college level. It prepares perspective plan for every academic year as well as long term development of the college. This cell prepares AQAR and submits in the NAAC central office.

6.3 Faculty Empowerment Strategies

6.3.1 The institution has effective welfare measures and Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

The management of Deshbhakt Babasaheb Bhausaheb Kanjire Shikshan Sanstha, Ichalkaranji and the college provide various welfare measures for well-being of teaching and non-teaching staff.

A) Welfare measures by the management -

2) Implementation of the compassion principle in recruitment of non-teaching staff. The management offers job to one of the family member after sudden death of staff in service. After death of Shri. Jawahar B. Kagwade (Class III, employee) the institution has appointed his son Shri. Rahil J. Kagwade on as junior clerk on “Anukampa Yojana” of Maharashtra Government.

B) Welfare measures by the institute - 1) Group insurance scheme for the standard for staff (GSLI),

as well as parents is adopted as per Shivaji University Kolhapur Guidelines.

- 2) Our staff has facility to take various types of leaves i.e. Duty leave, on duty leave, medical leave, earned leave, casual leave etc. first aid treatment.
- 3) Facility to provident fund amount cutting & maintain record Gratuity and family pension and medical reimbursements is made available since inception of the institution.
- 4) Group insurance scheme is also implemented by Bank of Maharashtra for the staff.
- 5) The institute always felicitate to teaching and non-teaching staff.
- 6) Facilities, like, salary certificate provision, bank guarantee for loan proposals, character certificate etc. also provided by the institution.
- 7) Internet and library facilities are freely availed to staff members.
- 8) The institute provides uniforms to class IV employees a free up charge. In the college performance appraisal system for teaching and non-teaching staff is practiced as per the guidelines of the UGC, State Government and the affiliating university. For teaching staff, performance based appraisal system (PBAS) and from the academic year 2019-2020, Annual Staff - Appraisal Reports (ASAR) are collected and scrutinized by IQAC and scrutiny committee formed for this purpose for non-teaching staff, annual confidential reports are maintained by the office authority, taking cognizance of performance and compliance with the duties and orders of the administration. Again the principal verifies these confidential reports (CRS) and submit to management authority for their remark. These CRS are taken into consideration for promotion of non-teaching staff.

As per guidelines of our affiliated Shivaji University, Kolhapur PBAS has introduced for the assessment and appraisal of the teaching staff, complying with the UGC notification as on 30th June, 2010 (Amended in 2016) and this has been approved by Govt. of Maharashtra. The University has introduced Academic performance indicator (API) based on PBAS. The college has formed the scrutiny committee to scrutinize the submitted APIs along with supporting documents, after verification by concerned HOD. From the academic year 2019-20, annual self-appraisal reports (ASAR) are put in place of PBAS; vide 7th pay UGC regulation, 18th July, 2018 and government of Maharashtra resolution on 8th March, 2019. Every year the college collects structure of feedback from students on teachers and after analysis necessary suggestions are made to the teachers for improvement. A Confidential Reports (CR) were used to appraise the performance of non-teaching staff as per standard code Rules, 1984. Student's suggestion box is another informal source for collecting feedback about performance of and services provided by the institution.

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6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1 Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

Every academic year the college prepares annual budget in advance considering the requirements of different subject departments and gymkhana committees related to curricular and extra-curricular activities of the college. Finally budget is sanctioned by CDC and IQAC. All the accounting records including vouchers, pay bills, quotation and payment receipts are maintained by the office.

Top management and head of the institution monitor all the financial matters and have clear policy and mechanism to monitor effective and efficient well planned strategies of available financial resources.

* The financial sources of the college are –

- 1) Admission, tuition & other fees are collected by the college from students.
- 2) Examination grants is received from the affiliated university, EBC and BC scholarship grants are received from Government of Maharashtra.
- 3) The budgetary resources of the college include plan and non-plan grants received from UGC.
- 4) Salary grant is received from Government of Maharashtra.

The college conducts internal and external financial audits regularly. The college has the internal and external audit mechanism. Timely internal audit is carried out by auditors appointed by the management within the financial year. Regarding the external audit, it also carried out by the authorized Chartered Accountant appointed by the management of the institution. The government audit is carried out by the joint director of higher education and senior auditor general of Maharashtra state (CAG). The queries of internal audit are cleared and are sent to external audit; the queries of external audit are also cleared and are sent to Govt. audit. In the beginning of the year the annual budget of the academic year is prepared by the IQAC and sent to governing council through college development committee. The funds are made available with the priority on need basis when necessary; with the prior permission of the principal and management the concerned quotations are invited. All formalities and implementation or rules are completed by the administrative office.

Our college is aided by the government of Maharashtra and is listed by the UGC under section 2(f) & 12 (B). Hence, grants from the UGC are the major source of the resource mobilization. At the college level, the major source of funds are comes through tuition fees as well as fees like, library fee, gymkhana, magazine, examination fees etc. collected from the students. In the same extent, funds were received through self - financing and professional courses. The major salary grants received from the state government, planned and non-planned grants are received from the UGC, merely funds are received from alumni. Funds also received from the Shivaji University for NSS,

Examination and Lead College scheme.

Optimal utilization of resources - Every year the annual budget is prepared and it has sanctioned through college development committee (CDC) and local managing committee. The budget for each activity is prepared by the concerned coordinator of the activity or by the head of the department. The Library budget is also prepared. But the control over the expenditure throughout the year is maintained by the principal with consensus by the Hon. Chairman of the institute.

7.2 Best Practices

7.2.1 Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Response:

1] Title:- Registration of Third Gender as Voters.

2] Objectives of the Practice:- Approximate population of third gender in Maharashtra was 10 lacks and out of them near about 1700 persons was registered. So that new Election Commission of Maharashtra had launched the special drive and took the help of NGO's for the task. Being a social responsibility our students had took active part in the above task.

- a) To motivate third gender voters to register and to take active part in voting process.
- b) The practicing this Program is to make aware the third gender community about their rights to vote.
- c) To create awareness among the students about equal right principle of voting.
- d) To create better environment for gender equality in the society and also in the students.

3] The Context of the Practice:- Since independence despite of many movements regarding problems of third gender, no consideration about them as the voters. But voting is a not only a right but privilege to the third gender persons. Registration of voters is the step towards empowerment of third gender. Despite of many movements third gender community were not aware about their fundamental right of voting. The students took the task enthusiastically and the Election Officials of Ichalkaranji happily accepted the proposal of our college.

4] The Practice:- First the students collected the addresses and made the groups and the door to door personal meeting had been conducted. After the efforts of 15-20 days they were agreed for registration. More than 50 eligible third gender voters we found in Ichalkaranji Constituency. Election Commission had allowed the birth certificate given by their parents (guru maa) accept as the proof of birth date. After efforts of 46 days most of the third gender persons were ready with their documents. The registration form third gender is clearly mentioned. That was made them to get noticed. Essential papers were properly presented with the help of the students, near about 40 persons got registered and later on got voting cards. Thus the practice was successfully done by the students.

5] Evidence of Success:- After hard and smart work we registered them as voters. But when they got voting cards they phoned us. Thus we got the feedback. When first batch got the cards the second batch took interest and some of them are still in the pipeline. After getting the cards more than 30 third gender voting card holders casted their votes in Loksabha Election 2019!. Later on the second batch got the cards and them casted their votes for Assembly Election 2019.

6] Problems Encountered and Resources required:-

- i) To collect the list the persons To collect the list of the third gender persons was a tedious job. It was very difficult to convince them for registration.
- ii) Contacts The students got address and met them personally. But most of them were not aware, about the significance of the voting card and its privilege.
- iii) To bring them for registration Most of them put the reasons that they had no time & no essential documents and as they were busy. All the doubts had to be cleared and task got cleared.

II) Title of the Practice – Demonstration and Dramatization of Voting at polling station for the Parliament and Assembly Election-2019.

2) Objectives of the Practice:- a) To make acquainted the polling officials for how to conduct voting smoothly without any disturbance. b) To create awareness in the officials about new rules and use of technology.

c) To educate officials and peoples about trust on the democracy.

d) To make awareness about polling mechanism among the people to cast their vote successfully.

e) To encourage people for voting without fear.

f) To eliminate pressure in the voting process through demonstration and dramatization of voting mechanism.

3) The context:- The mechanism of voting has great importance for trust worthiness and success of democracy. Start from beginning voting mechanism has changed timely. Nowadays electronic instruments (EVM and VVPAT) were used for voting process. The presiding officers and other polling officers have also doubt whether they can handle the voters successfully? It has been observed that when all are under tremendous pressure in the time of actual voting. So Demonstration and Dramatization of voting process is necessary to create confidence among all the stake holders including voters.

4) The Practice:- The officials appointed for election has to undergo the training sessions. Towards this necessary theoretical training is given by the concerned senior officials of the government. Purposefully our students actively participate in Demonstration and Dramatization of Voting at polling stations for Parliament and Assembly election –2019 of Maharashtra. Our students present dramatization of voting issues about selected type of voters were taken as examples i.e. all women voters in Purdah, third gender Voters, illiterate voters, old aged voters, handicapped voters, the voters create nuisance, tender voters etc. A uniqueness of this best practice in the context of Indian higher education is that it is necessary and important to create literacy about voting mechanism and trustworthiness of democracy among the students with theoretical as well as practical demonstration. They told that, they understood very quickly within half an hour. Further they said that they came to know the serious constrain or limitations to do this practice.

5) Evidence of Success:- It had been experienced that officials who undergone the training sessions were happy about student’s demonstration and dramatization of voting at polling station for the Parliament and Assembly election-2019 to understand critical issues of some selected type of voters. So repeatedly the dramatization was staged at time of training. Our students successfully delivered programs. So the students were enthusiastically participating in the Practice. There were many training sessions before the parliament and assembly election-2019. Thus the entire task was completed successfully in the lance of minimization of problems encounter in voting process.

6) Problems Encountered and Resources Required:- students completed the task with minimum resources by adjusting their daily working hours. They did not use expensive tools for demonstration and dramatization of voting at polling station for the Parliament and Assembly election2019. Another misunderstanding was that how the college students can give us the training as they are inexperienced. Despite of that no serious problem encountered.
